VICE PRESIDENT: COLLECTIVE BARGAINING – Barry Wittevrongel

ELECTION:

James Bedford, Past President of the LRTA was elected to a two year term on Provincial Executive.

FEES:

Disability Benefits Plan premium will be reduced by .32 of a percent, meaning an approximate reduction of \$224 will occur on a \$70 000 salary for the next year.

MTS fees are reduced by 5.4%. Current fee is \$882, in September the fee will be reduced to \$835. (In April, LRTA local fees were also reduced by \$35. Our local fee will be \$100 next year.)

LRTA RESOLUTIONS APPROVED AT AGM INCLUDE:

TRAF Appointments

The Society will ensure at least one nominee to the TRAF Board be named from the general membership exclusive of the Provincial Executive.

PD for Report Cards

The Society will lobby the Provincial Government for one additional day of in-service in the 2012/13 school year to be devoted solely to training for the writing of the new provincial report card and further that this training come prior to the preparation of the first report card.

Preparation Time for Report Card Preparation

The Society will lobby the Provincial Government for at least one half-day of student evaluation time per reporting period, devoted solely to report card preparation, to come from the currently allotted days for school administration/student evaluation.

OTHER SIGNIFICANT CHANGES FROM AGM:

Code of Professional Practice

It is also important to note that the Code of Professional Practice has been amended. It can be found on the Society's website. One significant change is "teacher" has been replaced by "member". Member is a more inclusive term; it better describes all who are a part of the Code of Professional Practice.

Article 9 states that, "A member adheres to collective agreements negotiated by the professional organization." In the preamble, "professional behaviour must reflect the spirit as well as the letter of the code." All LRTA members need to be cognizant that all clauses in our collective agreement, such as uninterrupted meal period (Article 10.00), extra-curricular activities are voluntary (Article 6.12) and discretionary leave (Article 6.10), require members to abide by the spirit and the letter of the code...mts
