AGM this year considered many important resolutions,

not the least of which was a resolution to adopt a new set of Bylaws for the Society. The proposed Bylaws were the result of two years of work to reorganize the existing Bylaws, eliminating duplication, bringing some existing policy into the Bylaws and, with the assistance of legal counsel, introducing some new wording to strengthen the Society. After much debate, the new Bylaws were adopted. There was much discussion around the status of members on leave during the debate, and it was understood that the concerns would be taken under advisement by the Provincial Executive and, in all likelihood a resolution will be brought forward at AGM 2015 on this matter.







Along with Bylaw reorganization, a separate

resolution proposed a reorganization of MTS Policies. The document brought for approval represented two years of work, much of it at the committee level, to eliminate policies that were no longer required. As with the Bylaw resolution, the assembly approved the new policy document. Another resolution called for the Society to move to Biennial General Meetings with a membership engagement forum to be held in the intervening years. After considerable debate, the resolution was defeated.

The assembly heard from the Minister of

Education, James Allum, who spoke of the progress made by the current government in public education, and the cuts in public education made by the Conservative government when they were last in power. Kevin Rebeck, president of the Manitoba Federation of Labour (MFL), spoke about the common goals that MTS and MFL share and advocate for. A presentation was made to former Minister of Education Nancy Allen in recognition of her work on passing Bill 18 and creating safer schools in Manitoba. Also acknowledged at AGM was Jeff Norton, ex-CEO of TRAF, for his years of dedicated service.



Elected to Provincial Executive were Sean

Kemble (STA), Arlyn Filewich (PTTA), Ray Desautels (StJATA) and James Bedford (LRTA). The MTS membership fee for 2015/16 will be \$939. The COSL fee with be \$150. The Disability Benefit Plan premium Long Term Disability fee will be 1.21% of salary, the lowest premium ever approved for the Plan.

HETEROSEXUAL QUESTIONNAIRE



Adapted from the work of Dr. Martin Rochlin (1972)

LGBTQ persons are often confronted with questions and assumptions about their lives that are stereotypical, incorrect and disrespectful. This questionnaire can help non-LGBTQ people understand what it feels like to be faced with these assumptions. It can be used to raise awareness of heterosexual privilege and bias.

- 1. : : What do you think caused your heterosexuality?
- 2. : : When and how did you first decide you were a heterosexual?
- 3. : : Is it possible your heterosexuality is just a phase you may
 - : grow out of?
- 4. : : Could it be that your heterosexuality stems from a neurotic: fear of others of the same sex?
- 5. : : If you've never slept with a person of the same sex, how can: you be sure you wouldn't prefer that?
- 6. : ': To whom have you disclosed your heterosexual tendencies?
 - : ': How did they react?
- 7.: Why do heterosexuals feel compelled to seduce others into : their lifestyle?
- 8. : : Why do you insist on flaunting your heterosexuality? Can't you
 - : just be what you are and keep it quiet?
 - ': Would you want your children to be heterosexual, knowing
 - : : the problems they'd face?
- 10. : : A disproportionate majority of child molesters are
 - . heterosexual men. Do you consider it safe to expose children to heterosexual male leaders
- 11. : : With all the societal support for marriage, the divorce rate is

spiraling. Why are there so few stable relationships among ': heterosexuals?
